IMPORTANT FACTS ABOUT YOUR NO FAULT DIVORCE

1. All parties must sign.
2. The waiting period for a divorce is sixty days from filing. This does not mean on the 61 st day you are automatically divorced. All it means is that upon the expiration of this period then the attorney will make an appointment that is convenient to his schedule and that of the assigned judge to submit your divorce. Should the judge require changes, then all parties would have to sign the new documents.
